

2008 CERB LIFT Program Application Descriptions

Applicant	Annual Authority Requested	Project Description
City of Bremerton	\$730,000	Bremerton's improvements in the downtown area will include improvements to Pacific Avenue, the construction of a 3,200 foot boardwalk, and the construction of a parking garage. It is anticipated that these improvements will lead to the creation of 1,800 jobs.
Clark County	\$500,000	Clark County will construct various improvements along Northeast 179 th Street, roundabouts to the east and west of the freeway interchange, widening Northeast 179 th from I-5 to Northeast 15 th Avenue, and extending Northeast 15 th Avenue. It is anticipated that these improvements will lead to the creation of 2,300 jobs.
City of Mount Vernon	\$500,000	Mount Vernon's improvements will include the construction of a waterfront promenade, urban trail, and other park facilities, structured parking in the downtown, and various street improvements. It is estimated that these improvements will lead to the creation of 2,500 jobs.
City of Puyallup	\$1 million	Puyallup's goal is to redevelop several city-owned parcels in the downtown area into structured parking with mixed-use development over the parking and to provide for pedestrian, parks, trail, storm water, and telecommunications improvements in the South Hill area. It is estimated that these, along with other non-LIFT financed improvements, will generate 8,600 jobs.
City of Tacoma	\$1 million	Tacoma plans to construct parking structure(s) to accommodate 1,500 vehicles, various street improvements, utility infrastructure, and sustainable storm drainage in the area linking the Tacoma Dome to the International Financial Services Area. It is estimated that these improvements will generate 11,500 jobs.

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City of University Place	\$1 million	University Place’s improvements will be a 1,200 stall parking structure, park, open space, and public art improvements, enhanced pedestrian facilities, street improvements, and various utility improvements. It is anticipated that these will generate 1,600 new jobs.
City of Vancouver	\$500,000	Vancouver’s improvements in the Columbia Waterfront RDA will consist of street improvements to connect the RDA with downtown Vancouver and provide waterfront trail, greenway, and public plaza improvements. It is estimated that these, along with other non-LIFT financed improvements, will generate 2,700 jobs.
Whitman County	\$362,000	Whitman County’s improvements to the Pullman/Moscow Corridor Improvement District will include street and road improvements, stormwater improvements, various utility improvements including the construction of a sewer treatment facility, and other improvements such as bicycle path and trail improvements, transit stops, and park and ride facilities. It is estimated that these improvements will generate 1,400 jobs.
City of Yakima	\$1 million	Yakima’s improvements within the RDA will include improvements to the “H” Street and I-82 interchange, Loop Road improvements, and a Martin Luther King and 10 th Street extension and roundabout. It is estimated that these improvements will generate 4,600 jobs.
