Notice of Intent to release a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Consulting Services

The Washington State Department of Commerce intends to release a Request for Proposal (RFP) on February 15, 2022, for Consulting Services to perform a Needs Assessment of Washington's Building Energy Efficiency Services for Vulnerable and Hard to Reach Populations and Communities. Vulnerable and hard to reach communities include low and moderate income households, historically underserved populations (race and ethnicity), hard to reach populations (renters, multi-family, non-utility fuels), and Climate or Environmental Health Disparity impacted communities.

The purpose of this notice is to provide early awareness of this impending RFP in our effort to support broad and fair competition for this procurement.

Public Meeting and Comment Period: Commerce will be hosting a voluntary web-based public meeting for interested parties to allow potential applicants and interested parties to learn about the background and expected scope of services associated with this opportunity. Expected Scope of Services: Below are targeted objectives for the consulting services related to this opportunity that may be adjusted based on the submitted comments. The objectives have been organized under the following:

- Comprehensively assess the needs and strategies for providing <u>building energy efficiency services</u>*
 to vulnerable, hard to reach, and highly impacted households in Washington State
 - Leverage existing system and program data and information; supplement with additional data collection from stakeholders where required.
 - Analysis would be used to guide/feed/align existing building-sector energy initiatives and legislative reporting
- Assess the strengths and limitations of the existing building energy services and delivery systems
 - Include utility, federal, and state funded programs
 - Identify opportunities for strengthening the existing programs and address regulatory/compliance issues (requirements and costs)

- Identify viable options to meet state energy strategy goals for scaling up building energy efficiency services to equitably serve low-income populations focusing on investment gaps and opportunities and strategies to address un- and under-served populations, communities and buildings they live in. Produce a draft report of preliminary findings and recommendations for review
- Produce a final report describing the full results and recommendations associated with the project
- Support implementation of the recommendations

* Building energy efficiency services include:

- Low-income weatherization assistance program including the Home Rehabilitation Loan
 Program
- Washington State University's Community Energy Efficiency Program (moderate income hard to reach)
- Utility weatherization programs
- LIHEAP Energy Assistance
- Utility energy bill assistance
- This may include residential building standard for existing buildings.
